## CLIENT DEMOGRAPHICS

- On average, 1,215 households were served each week.
- Seniors (65+) accessing our services increased by 2% compared to 2024.
- 19% of our clients are school-aged children (ages 5-17) and 8% of our clients are post-secondary students.
- Most commonly spoken languages: English, Mandarin, Cantonese, Tagalog, Ukrainian, Spanish.
- Most common ethnicities: Chinese, White, Filipino, Latin American, West Asian, South Asian.

## YOUR IMPACT

- \$6.6 million worth of food recovered and 1.6 million kgs of CO2 emissions saved.
- 89% of food distributed comes from rescued surplus, which would otherwise go to waste.
- Wholesale donations increased by 49%.
- Individual monetary contributions increased by 22%.
- 212 volunteers contributed 25,245 volunteer hours, equivalent to 14 FTEs.
- 35 volunteer groups contributed a total of 1,197 volunteer hours.
